### **Vietnam Files**

#### **BATTLE OF CHU LAI**

On August 18, 1965, the U.S. Marine Corps launched the first major military operation of the Vietnam War named "Operation Starlight." The objective was to surprise the 1st Viet Cong Regiment which had gathered for an attack on the Chu Lai Marine Air Base, fifty miles south of DaNang. The 1st V.C. Regiment had established their base of operations on the Van Tuong Peninsula 8 miles southeast of the Chu Lai Marine Air Base, Skyhawks and Phantoms of VMA-342 and VMFA-513. The Marine Corps command decision was made to preempt the planned attack on the Air Base by attacking the enemy forces on their own ground. Operation Starlight included the 7th Marine Regiment, with ground operations to include the 3rd Bn., 3rd Marines; 2nd Bn., 4th Marines; K Btry., 4th Bn., 12th Marines; 3rd BN., 7th Marines, including M-48 tanks. Air operations would include Marine Corps fighter aircraft from MAG-11 flying out of DaNang, MAG-12 flying from the Chu Lai Marine Air Base. The Marine units on the ground would be further supported by U.S. Naval gunfire from offshore ships, and UH-34D helicopters from HMM Squadrons 261 and 361. Operation Starlight would include land and sea approaches, and take the Marines through several villages, including Au Cuong and Nam Yen. By the end of the battle, 45 Marines had been killed, with over 200 wounded. Enemy forces sustained major casualties with well over 600 confirmed killed. Two Medals of Honor were awarded, the first of the Vietnam War.

### **SCHOLARSHIP AWARD**

The First MAW Association will award five scholarships of \$500 each during Reunion '07. To qualify for a scholarship, applicants must meet the following qualifications:

• Be a First MAW Assn. regular member in good standing (i.e., dues are up to date), their spouse, dependent, or direct descendent. Further, the member must have a minimum of one-year membership as of June 1, 2006.

-OR-

Be a spouse, dependent, or direct descendent of a deceased member of the First MAW Assn.

-OR-

- Be a spouse, dependent, or direct descendent of a Marine or member of another military service, who lost his/her life while serving in Vietnam with the First Marine Aircraft Wing.
- Applicant must be presently enrolled in an accredited college, university, or trade school and in good academic standing.
- Applicant will be required to submit an essay of 300 350 words. The applicant can choose one of the following topics:
  - 1. What the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Means to Me.
  - 2. What the Marine Corps War Memorial Means to Me.
  - 3. How I plan to use my education to aide society
  - 4. Why I support our Marines who are in harms way

To compete for a scholarship, applicants must submit their essay in accordance with the following instructions:

The essay must be typed. Do not include applicants name on the essay. Attach a separate sheet of paper containing applicant's name, member's name and membership number, address, and phone number.

A letter from a counselor or other school official verifying that applicant is currently enrolled. The letter must be on school letterhead.

A copy of student transcripts

The essay must be postmarked no later than March 15, 2007.
